The journal will continue to emerge quarterly, publishing peer-reviewed articles, debates and shorter pieces, and information. Universitetsforlaget will continue as the publisher. Special issues will amount to at the most a quarter of the issues.

Idunn. Nevertheless, the purpose is that the journal will be one of the leading journals in terms of development and direction of educational research, which hopefully will attract new readers.
